Term of the Month

February's term of the month is wetland. February 2, 2024, was internationally recognized as World Wetlands Day. Wetlands are important ecological systems that are vital to supporting life on Earth, and are the unsung heroes of mitigating climate change: they are capable of storing 50 times more carbon than rain forests! They also control flooding, naturally filter wastewater, and provide food resources for animals and humans alike.

In the early 1700s, wetlands covered 25% of the total area of Indiana—equal to 5.6 million acres! Now, these important natural systems cover just 4% of the state.




Looking Ahead: St. Mary's Lake Clean Up
